GENS ETRUSCA



The following activities were created to accompany the video series "The Etruscans" found on Magister Craft's YouTube channel. The activities are organized by the video's title, and a link is included for your convenience. For each section, you will find activities to do before watching the video and activities once the video has been viewed.

The first activity to be done before watching the video is to help students create a mental framework which is to help them better understand and process the information they will receive from the video. The questions are designed to help students see parallels between their culture and the target culture. I strongly encourage teachers to have students share their answers and to open discussion to the class. This can be done in the target language though not necessarily, as that could limit the scope of the discussion. The Latin Brainstorming activity is designed to prepare students for the target language which will be used in the video. I encourage students use a dictionary during this section to take a bit more agency and to ensure participation. I find Latinitium's dictionary to be of great aid during these activities.

The two activities to be done after viewing the video consist in simple comprehension questions, which can certainly be expanded by the instructor, and a few images taken from each video to encourage students to use the Latin they just experienced while watching the video – students may also find watching the video multiple times helpful in finding the right vocabulary to describe the images. *Many of these larger images are dark and not well suited for black and white printing. I find it best to project these onto my classroom's big screen TV and have students write in their notes or on a separate sheet I have created for them.

Why the Etruscans? So much of what we call Roman, is actually Etruscan in varying degrees. Having at least a superficial knowledge / awareness of the Etruscans helps to provide proper context for understanding the Romans, especially early Romans. Too, I find these ancient people to be most fascinating. Perhaps it is because they are shrouded in mystery or perhaps because they are an ancient people whose relationship with nature is evident and not yet marred or lessened by human invention. No matter your reasons for being here, I thank you for allowing me to help you introduce this wonderful people to your students. May this work bring about truly fruitful conversations with your class, and I hope your students' acquisition of and love for Latin grow.
